Letter from Crown dated 29 June 2019

 Page 2, third paragraph, first sentence. "The Strategic Plan was developed with a wide-ranging current state analysis as the foundation for setting the direction." Is 'state' in the context of 'Australian states?' or is it 'as it is today'. ie. 'current state of play?'

Further Information/Clarification:

- > I confirm that this reference is intended to mean "as it is today", i.e. the current state of play.
- Page 2, fifth paragraph, first sentence. Crown states that points (a) to (I) of the recommendation are addressed as either initiatives or actions in Appendix A. Did Crown prepare a table mapping points (a) to (I) to the initiatives or actions for reference? If so, may we have a copy to include as a table to present to the Commission as confirmation.

Further Information/Clarification:

Crown did conduct mapping between the recommendation points (a) to (i) to the initiatives and actions, and a table presenting this mapping is provided in Attachment A.

3. Page 6 - RG cases: How this this term defined? I note the increase in 2018 but even then, it is less than one case per day on average (200 over 365 days).

Further Information/Clarification:

- The term "RG Case" is defined as an interaction between the RG Team and a Customer, in relation to a responsible gaming related matter. Examples of when these interactions would occur include:
 - o A self exclusion process
 - o Detected breaches of self exclusion orders (attempted or actual breaches)
 - o Petrons displaying observable signs / extended play periods
 - Revocation process enquiries
 - o Welfare checks on a patron
- Chart 2.2.3 shows that there was an average of approximately 200 interactions of this nature, per week (not per year).

4. Page 7, first paragraph - The table is said to be "reflective of the challenges...." How?

Further Information/Clarification:

- The underlying challenge associated with the implementation and use of player analytics is that it attempts to predict human behaviour. Accordingly, it relies heavily on the appropriateness of assumptions, and the accuracy and completeness of underlying gaming transactions (for carded players). Limited transactional information is available to use for uncarded players.
- > The table is reflective of the above challenges, by showing that:
 - Predictive modelling analysis is in place only in New Zealand and (as a trial) in the United Kingdom. It is not in place in the other jurisdictions.
 - Other player analytics are in place in other jurisdictions, but mostly for visit frequency and/or time, which are easier and more reliable metrics to capture and monitor.
- Appendix A, Page 21 Reference to RG team. How does Crown define RG team? Is it only RGC staff and RGAs?
